Roxbury Community College, founded in 1973, is a two-year, state-supported, co-educational institution of higher learning offering Associate Degrees and certificates to members of the Greater Boston community. It is the only college in New England serving a primarily minority based population.

The library at Roxbury Community College offers information resources and services that support the academic programs of the college. The library occupies an attractive and heavily used space on the first and second floors of the Academic Building. There is study space for about one hundred students. Every effort is made to support both those who require a quiet space for individual study and those who need to study in groups. There is a special room for group study on the first floor. About seventy-five classes per year visit the library classroom for instruction on information retrieval techniques. There are fourteen computers for students to access online library resources as well as the free Internet. Library staff members assist students in Internet navigation as well as web site evaluation. Equipment and software for those with disabilities is available. An online library newsletter, delivered to RCC email accounts, alerts users to information useful in their educational tasks. Library displays promote ideas of interest to the college community and showcase the accomplishments of college departments.

Features: 35,000 books, 40 databases, 100 paper periodicals, the complete writings of W.E.B. Du Bois on microfilm, the Boston Black United Front archival collection.

The library is a member of the Fenway Library Consortium and the Metro Boston Library Network.
